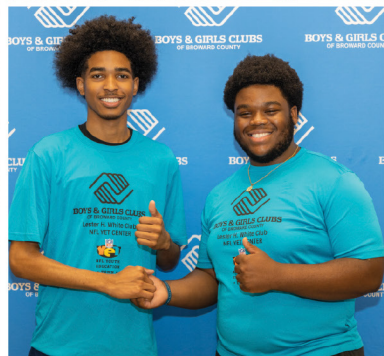

BGCBC SAFETY STANDARDS

At BGCBC, our top priority is ensuring the safety and well-being of each and every child we serve. We are deeply committed to creating and maintaining an environment where all young people feel safe, supported, and respected. We take all concerns of inappropriate behavior, including child sexual abuse or misconduct, extremely seriously and have strong policies, practices, and resources in place to prevent harm and respond appropriately.

BGCBC'S COMMITMENT TO SAFETY

We continually review and strengthen our safety policies, programs, and training for staff and volunteers to create a safe, welcoming, and supportive environment.

Our comprehensive safety measures include, but are not limited to:

- **Supervision:** Active and attentive supervision of all members during Club activities.
- **Transportation:** Clear and secure guidelines to ensure safe travel to and from the Club and on field trips.
- **Communication:** Safe, transparent, and appropriate communication practices between staff, volunteers, members, and families.
- **One-on-One Contact:** Strict policies prohibit one-on-one contact between adults and members under age 18.

24-HOUR TOLL-FREE CHILD SAFETY HOTLINE:

We encourage all staff, members, and families to report any incident or concern related to safety. Through our partnership with Presidium, a national leader in safety, we offer confidential access to a 24-hour, toll-free Child Safety Hotline:

This resource is available anytime to ensure concerns are heard and addressed promptly.

MANDATORY BACKGROUND & DRUG TESTING CHECKS:

BGCBC requires all employees and volunteers who have direct, repeated contact with youth to undergo:

- Annual criminal background checks through the Florida Department of Children & Families Background Screening Clearinghouse, in alignment with Boys & Girls Clubs of America (BGCA) membership requirements.
- Pre-employment and random drug screenings throughout the year, as part of our commitment to a drug-free workplace.

VISITOR MANAGEMENT SYSTEM:

To protect our Clubs, members, staff, and volunteers, every visitor is screened before entering our facilities. Our Visitor Management System checks individuals against the National Sex Offender Public Website (NSOPW) to identify any potential criminal activity, helping to maintain a secure environment for all.

SAFE PASSAGE POLICY:

To help us keep all members safe, BGCBC requires every member to scan their KidTrax card when arriving and leaving the Club each day. Members under age 12 must be escorted when leaving the Club. Members 12 years and older may leave unescorted only if their parent or caregiver has given consent, which is noted in their membership application.

REQUIRED IMMEDIATE REPORTING:

All BGCBC staff and volunteers are mandated reporters. This means they are required by law to immediately report any critical safety concerns or incidents to local authorities. We also report such incidents to Boys & Girls Clubs of America within 24 hours.

ONGOING SAFETY TRAINING:

Ongoing training and supervision are vital to keeping our Clubs safe and supportive environments. BGCBC staff participate in regular trainings and receive guidance from leading safety experts, including through Boys & Girls Clubs of America's Spillett Leadership University.

Training topics include:

Child Abuse Prevention and Mandated Reporting
Grooming Prevention | CPR & AED Certification
Active Shooter Preparedness | Youth Mental Health First Aid
Trauma-Responsive Practices | Diversity, Equity & Inclusion

SAFETY COMMITTEE:

BGCBC has a dedicated Safety Committee that provides input and guidance on local safety policies and strategies. The Committee has implemented the following:

- Annual safety training for all staff (full and part-time).
- A “Safety First” onboarding video and quiz for new employees to be completed during the onboarding phase of employment.
- Guidance and implementation of the BGCBC Pandemic Response.
- Regular facility safety checks to maintain a safe environment for all members.

STATE AND LOCAL LAWS:

We comply with federal, state, and local safety laws, including those impacting facilities and vehicles. To enhance the safety within our Clubs, we have installed Code Red sirens and a video security system.

SAFETY PARTNERSHIPS:

Locally, we partner with law enforcement agencies where our Clubs are located (Broward Sheriff’s Office, Hollywood Police Department, Fort Lauderdale Police Department, Lauderhill Police Department, and Davie Police Department) as well as 3rd-party safety consultants and various outside agencies committed to the protection of our youth.

Nationally, Boys & Girls Clubs of America collaborates with leading experts in safety, security, and technology to develop cutting-edge solutions for its Clubs. Partners include:

- National Child Safety Advisory Task Force made up of leading experts and organizations.
- Blue Ribbon Task Force, comprised of local Club leaders, that is charged with providing input on the safety direction and key safety initiatives.
- Mental Health First Aid, a national program that teaches skills to recognize and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges.
- Crisis Text Line, a confidential text message service for youth in times of crisis.

SAFETY DRILLS:

To ensure everyone is prepared in the event of an emergency, we conduct regular safety drills throughout the year, following established BGCBC procedures. These drills include fire drills, tornado and severe weather drills, and lockdown drills.

If you arrive during an active drill, we kindly ask that you wait until the drill has safely concluded before signing out your child. We understand this may be an inconvenience and appreciate your patience and understanding.

These drills are essential to helping our members and staff know how to respond calmly and effectively in real situations. Thank you for partnering with us to keep every child safe and supported.

SAFE PASSAGE

MEMBERS:

- Must scan in and out each day with their KidTrax card.
- May not leave the Club unescorted unless they are 12 years and older and have included in their membership application written parent/guardian consent. After scanning out for the day, Club members will not be permitted to return to the Club until the following day. Members that leave the Club for a doctor's visit or other emergency situation may be allowed to return to the Club at the Club Director's discretion. Members that leave the Club without permission may face disciplinary actions up to and including suspension and termination of membership.

PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

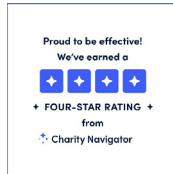
- Must retrieve child(ren) under 12 from the Club, identify and authorize a minimum of (3) additional contacts over 18, who may be picking-up their child(ren). Parent can make all necessary changes in the online management portal.
- In order for us to ensure the safety & security of our Club members, please be prepared to present your photo ID at the front desk so we may scan your information into our VMS database.
- May include in their membership application approval for members ages 12 and older that are current members of the club, to escort their younger sibling/family member, under the age of 12, out of the Club for the day.

BGCBC STAFF:

- Will not respond to phone calls requesting member/s to be dismissed without their authorized escort.
- Will review ID Cards for identified additional contacts once they arrive at the Club.
- Will not accept phone calls from parents/guardians requesting that an unidentified contact will be escorting members.
- Will not accept responsibility for any members that leave the Club unescorted/unsupervised and in breach of this policy.
- Phone calls, emails and faxes for authorization WILL NOT be accepted.

LATE POLICY

We understand that unexpected delays happen. To help us ensure the safety and well-being of our members, it is vital for your child/ren to be picked up on time. If you anticipate that you are going to be late, please call the Club to make the staff aware of your challenge.

To support our operations and staff the following late fees will apply:

- There will be a \$5.00 charge per child for the first 15 minutes you are late and a \$1.00 fee for every minute late thereafter.
- In the event that you are over 30 minutes late minutes late and in order to ensure the safety and well-being of our members, law enforcements or Child Protective Services may be contacted.
- Late fees not paid will affect your child's membership.
- Abuse of our late policy such as chronic late pick-up and/or unpaid late fees will be grounds for suspension and/or termination of membership.

The Club opens and closes promptly as posted. We ask that parents to ensure that their children do not arrive early or leave late. Children remaining at the Club at closing time will be taken in the office to call parent/ guardian or emergency contact to pick them up. If we are unable to get in touch with the parent/guardian or emergency contact after a 30-minute window, we reserve the right to contact local law enforcement and/or Child Protective Services to ensure the safety and well-being of the child.

CELL PHONE/PERSONAL DEVICE POLICY AGES 6-12

To help maintain a safe, respectful, and focused environment for all members, personal electronic devices, including cell phones, must be kept silent, stored out of sight (such as in a pocket, backpack, or purse), and not used during Club hours. This includes texting, gaming, taking photos or videos, internet use, and social media.

If a device is used during Club time or disrupts daily activities, staff will follow a progressive response approach. In some cases, the device may be held by staff and returned directly to a parent or caregiver at pick-up.

We understand the importance of staying connected, especially for families, so we have a phone line available for our members to use for urgent matters only. Please also note that the Club is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged personal devices.

CELL PHONE/ PERSONAL DEVICE POLICY AGES 13 AND UP

We are committed to fostering a safe, inclusive, and respectful environment, both in person and online. Members are expected to use language and technology in ways that reflect our values of kindness, responsibility, and mutual respect. Members ages 13 and up are welcome to use their own technology devices — including laptops, tablets, and smartphones — in designated, approved areas of the Club. To protect the privacy and safety of all members, personal devices are not permitted in locker rooms, restrooms, or any other area where privacy is expected. In these areas, devices must remain silent and stored away (e.g., in a backpack, pocket, or purse).

We trust and expect members to use their devices responsibly and respectfully. Inappropriate use — including behavior that compromises safety, privacy, or the positive environment of the Club — will be addressed. Depending on the situation, responses may include staff holding the device for parent/guardian pick-up, temporary suspension of device privileges, or, in serious cases, additional follow-up in line with Club policies and community safety standards, such as suspension, expulsion, or referral to local law enforcement.

INAPPROPRIATE COMMUNICATION includes the use of obscene, profane, rude, inflammatory, threatening, or disrespectful language or images — whether spoken, written, posted, or shared digitally. This also includes personal attacks, harassment, stalking, sharing false or harmful information, or posting content that could negatively affect an individual, the Club, or the broader community.

If a member is asked to stop sending or sharing communications that are making someone uncomfortable, they are expected to stop immediately. Using technology to intentionally harm, embarrass, or intimidate others — including through harassment, humiliation, or threats — is considered cyberbullying and is taken seriously.

CYBERBULLYING or any digital behavior that disrupts the safety and well-being of Club members, staff, or the community will be addressed as stated above with a focus on accountability, education, and restorative practices where appropriate. BGCBC staff may review personally owned devices brought into the Club if there are concerns about safety or policy violations. Parents/caregivers will be notified in advance and may choose to be present during the review. If permission for review is declined, the member may no longer be allowed to bring personal devices to the Club. Please note that BGCBC is not responsible for the loss, theft, damage, or misuse of personal devices brought to the Club.

RESTROOM SAFETY

Safety includes not only physical well-being, but also emotional and psychological comfort. To support this commitment:

- Club members must check in with a staff member before using the restroom. To help ensure privacy and safety, only one Club member may be in a Club restroom at a time, and adults are not permitted in youth restrooms unless there is an emergency or safety concern.
- While on a field trip, staff will remain nearby, outside the area, to ensure safety through auditory monitoring and by keeping track of who enters and exits. To support peer accountability and safety, youth are encouraged to go in groups of at least three and are taught how to recognize and report any inappropriate behavior to a trusted staff member.
- Staff and volunteers are asked to use the designated adult-only restrooms and changing areas. Youth restrooms are reserved solely for youth members to help ensure their privacy and comfort.
- Staff may monitor restrooms discreetly from the outside to ensure youth safety. Surveillance cameras are placed only outside the restroom areas to monitor general traffic in and out.
- If a staff member needs to check a restroom or changing area for damage, misuse, or to address a safety concern, they will first ensure no youth are inside. The area will be temporarily closed to youth during this time.
- If a youth becomes ill or injured in a restroom or changing area, a staff member will respond with the support of a colleague while ensuring other youth are not present to protect the youth's privacy and dignity.

MEMBERSHIP

- Boys & Girls Club membership is open to all youth **age 6 (in the first grade) through age 18.**
- Children ages 6 & 7 must show proof of age (e.g. original birth certificates, passports, green cards) AND 6-year-olds must provide proof of enrollment in the first grade or higher for the 2025-2026 school year.
- All members must provide proof of Student School ID number upon registering. Boys & Girls Clubs of Broward County will provide an equal opportunity for all members to receive access to services provided regardless of race, ethnicity, sex, color, sexual orientation, age, disability, religion, or national origin.
- A parent must attend an orientation each new program year prior to registering their child(ren) for the Club. Teens ages 15+ may attend their own orientation as long as parent completes and signs the membership application.

- Only parents/legal guardians may register child(ren) for Club membership. The parent/guardian who creates the online account in our KidTrax portal is the one who can update or make changes to the membership application. There is a \$15.00 annual membership fee for each child and is payable through the secure KidTrax portal. Boys & Girls Clubs of Broward County memberships are valid from the first day of the Broward County public school year through the last day of the county's student summer break.

MEDICINE

Staff are not permitted to store or administer any prescription or non-prescription medications. We understand this may present challenge for some families, and we encourage you to speak with us if you need support in exploring alternative solutions.

CLUB CARDS

Each Club member is required to carry his/her Club membership card at all times while at the Club. Should a card be lost, replacement cards can be purchased for \$1.00 each. Club Cards are required on a daily basis.

MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

Every member plays an important role in creating a safe, respectful, and welcoming environment. We all share the responsibility of making the Club a fun, supportive, and memorable place to be.

To help guide us, we focus on three core expectations that support the well-being of everyone in our community:

1. Respect yourself and others.
2. Respect all staff and volunteers.
3. Respect Club property and equipment.

To ensure the Club remains a safe, respectful, and positive space for all members, certain behaviors are not permitted. These include, but are not limited to:

- The use of disrespectful or hurtful language (including swearing or verbal abuse).
- Inappropriate or unwanted physical contact, including sexual or violent behavior.
- Fighting or any form of physical harm toward others.
- Possession or use of alcohol, tobacco, vaping products, controlled substances, or weapons.
- Stealing or damaging property.
- Bullying of any kind, including cyberbullying.

DRESS CODE

At the Club, we want everyone to feel safe, respected, and comfortable. We also understand that access to clothing varies and that style is an important part of self-expression. To help maintain a positive, inclusive environment where all members can thrive, we ask that clothing choices reflect our shared community values.

GENERAL GUIDELINES:

- Clothing should be worn in a way that provides coverage and comfort during everyday activities. For example, pants should be secured at the waist, and undergarments kept private.
- Closed-toe shoes are required at all times for safety. Please note that Crocs or similar footwear may not meet our safety guidelines.
- Shorts and skirts should be long enough to support ease of movement and comfort throughout the day.

To Support a Safe and Welcoming Environment, Club members may not wear:

- Clothing that may not provide enough coverage during movement (e.g., very tight or revealing items).
- Outfits that include sexually explicit or suggestive messages or imagery.
- Clothing, jewelry, or accessories that reference drugs, alcohol, tobacco, weapons, violence, or harmful language or graphics.
- Items linked to gang affiliation or symbols that could cause discomfort or disruption for others.
- Hats, hoods, or head coverings indoors — unless worn for religious or cultural reasons.

If you're ever unsure about what's okay to wear or need support with clothing access or accommodations, please connect with a staff member — we're here to listen and help without judgment.

BEHAVIOR SUPPORT & RESPONSE

We believe that creating a positive, engaging, and supportive environment helps prevent challenging behaviors. By offering fun, meaningful activities and promoting strong values, we aim to guide members toward making respectful and responsible choices.

We understand that everyone makes mistakes and that behavior is often a form of communication. When a member struggles to meet expectations, our staff will respond with care, consistency, and fairness.

Supportive action will be:

- **INDIVIDUALIZED:** Responses are based on the specific situation, taking into account the needs and circumstances of the member.
- **RESPECTFUL:** Members will be treated with dignity, and efforts will be made to understand the root of the behavior.
- **RESTORATIVE:** Whenever possible, we'll focus on repairing harm, rebuilding trust, and helping members learn from their actions.

All guidance and interventions are handled by trained Boys & Girls Club professionals, who are committed to fostering a safe and inclusive space for every young person.

If you or your child ever has questions about our behavior expectations or needs support, please know that we're here to help, not to punish, but to partner with families in nurturing growth and belonging.

SUSPENSION/EXPULSION

While we are committed to working with members and families to support positive behaviors and growth, there may be instances when suspension or expulsion becomes necessary.

In situations where a member's actions significantly impact the safety, well-being, or functioning of the Club, BGCBC reserves the right to suspend or remove that member. These decisions are made carefully and on a case-by-case basis by BGCBC professional staff. Parents/caregivers will be contacted promptly if a suspension or expulsion occurs. Please note that when a member is suspended or expelled from their home Club, the suspension/expulsion applies to all Clubs within BGCBC.

We strive to approach each situation with empathy and fairness while maintaining a safe environment for all.

FAMILY CONDUCT AND EXPECTATIONS

BGCBC is a community built on mutual respect and shared values. To ensure a supportive and welcoming environment, we ask that all communication between parents/caregivers and staff remain respectful. If concerns arise, we encourage open dialogue and a problem-solving approach. We're here to help.

We have a **Zero Tolerance Policy** for behavior that is aggressive, threatening, or verbally abusive — whether in person or over the phone. This includes:

- Profane or disrespectful language
- Threats or intimidation
- Physical or verbal aggression

Our goal is always to work in partnership with families to support the success and well-being of every young person. However, any parent, caregiver, or individual exhibiting these behaviors may be restricted from entering or engaging with any BGCBC facility, program, or staff member.

FIELD TRIPS:

Field trips are a valuable part of our program experience, offering members opportunities to explore, learn, and have fun outside of the Club. We're excited to provide these meaningful experiences and appreciate your partnership in making them successful.

To ensure each trip is safe and well-organized, the following guidelines apply:

- Parent/guardian authorization is required for all field trips. A signed permission form must be submitted for each trip.
- Deadlines matter. Forms must be returned by the specified date in order to reserve transportation, purchase tickets, and plan logistics.
- Verbal permission or handwritten notes cannot be accepted, as we must follow official documentation protocols for the safety of all participants.

It is the responsibility of the member and their parent/caregiver to return the completed permission form by the deadline. Unfortunately, members who do not submit their forms on time may not be able to attend the trip. If you have questions or need support with completing forms, please connect with Club staff. We want every child to have the opportunity to participate whenever possible.

LOITERING

To help ensure the safety and well-being of all members, BGCBC requires that members refrain from gathering or remaining on or around Club property — including nearby parks, shops, playgrounds, or other surrounding areas — before arrival or after dismissal from the Club.

We care deeply about our members' safety, and unsupervised congregating in these areas may pose risks. We kindly ask families to support this policy by ensuring timely drop-off and pick-up.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

To help keep our Club environment safe, organized, and focused on fun and learning, we ask that members leave personal belongings—such as toys, electronics, and valuables—at home.

Please note:

- BGCBC is **not responsible** for any personal items that are lost, damaged, or stolen at the Club or during field trips.
- We are **unable to offer reimbursements** for such items.
- For safety reasons, members are **not permitted to carry book bags, purses, tote bags,** or similar items during Club hours. All belongings must be stored in a designated area upon arrival.

We appreciate your support in helping us maintain a secure and respectful space for everyone. If you have specific concerns or needs regarding personal items, please feel free to speak with a staff member.

DAMAGE TO CLUB PROPERTY

We encourage all members to take care of Club spaces, materials, and equipment so that everyone can enjoy a safe and welcoming Club environment. If Club property is intentionally damaged or misused, families will be asked to help cover the cost of repair or replacement.

In such cases, Club staff will communicate directly with parents or caregivers to discuss the situation and work together on a fair resolution. We understand that accidents can happen, and our goal is always to approach these situations with understanding and partnership.

REPORTS & VIDEO FOOTAGE

We are committed to protecting the privacy and confidentiality of our members, Families and staff. For this reason we do not release copies of club documents or provide access to video footage. Access to such materials will only be guaranteed when required by valid court order.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we work to maintain a safe and respectful environment for everyone in our club community.

PHONES

To help maintain a focused and safe environment, front desk phones are reserved for emergency use only. If there is an urgent need to reach a parent or caregiver, Club staff will make the call.

We understand that parents may have concerns throughout the day. For non-emergency matters, we encourage families to speak with staff during pick-up. Please note that members will not be called to the front desk to receive phone calls during Club hours.

This policy helps minimize disruptions and ensures that staff can stay focused on caring for and supporting all Club members.

REASONABLE SUSPICION SEARCH:

The safety of our members, staff, and community is our top priority. In situations where there is **reasonable suspicion** that a member may be in possession of prohibited or illegal substances or items, staff may conduct a search of the member's backpack, bag, or personal belongings to ensure the safety of all. These actions are taken with care, discretion, and respect for the individual. In certain cases, safety procedures may also include the use of **metal detectors or trained safety animals**, as permitted by law.

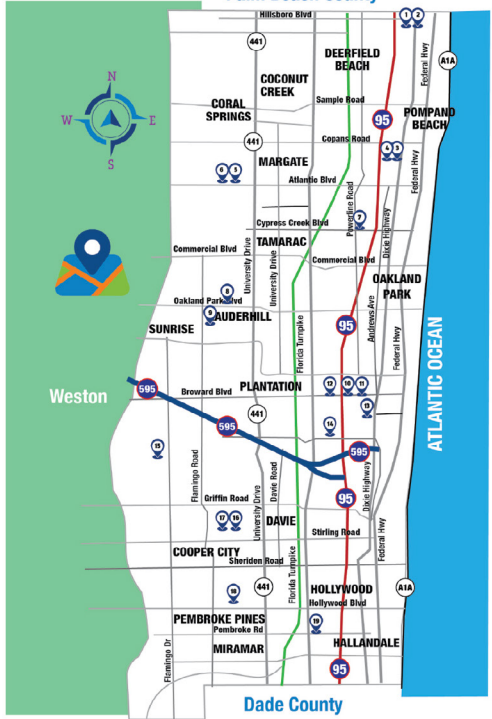
